

Decent Work, Mental Health Wellbeing and Job Satisfaction: Evidence from Women Brickfield Workers, West Bengal

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Abstract: This study aims to find the relationship between decent work-derived mental health wellbeing and job satisfaction where it highlights specially on the women workers who claim more attention at workplace for their safety-security issues. The cross-sectional study has collected responses randomly from 281 brickfield workers of four districts of West Bengal (Bankura, Purulia, West Midnapore and Hooghly) which are found significant for their contributions in brickfield. With established scales (ILO-NIOSH WellBQ) and Structural Equation Modelling (AMOS, Version 23), the study has concluded that a 1% change in decent work-derived mental health wellbeing can generate 27% change in job satisfaction of women workers. It hence proves its policy implication by identifying and improving the decent work-derived mental health issues of women workers of unorganised sectors, like the brickfield.
